Report of the Internal Student Seminar titled ‘Caste and Tribe in Modern India’ organized by the Department of Sociology of Bamanpukur Humayun Kabir Mahavidyalaya held on 18th February, 2020

An internal student seminar was convened by Dr. Runa Das Chaudhuri, the Head of The Department of Sociology, Bamanpukur Humayun Kabir Mahavidyalaya on the topic ‘Caste and Tribe in Modern India’. The venue of the aforesaid programme held between 1p.m. to 3p.m. on 18th February, 2020 was the Seminar Hall, BHKM. The total number of students who attended the programme was 131 and the number of teaching faculty who graced the occasion was 13.



Details of the programme:

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. Subash Biswas, Principal, BHKM by the lighting of the candle stand. He then delivered his welcome speech encouraging students to come forth to share their ideas on ideas and concepts that they were learning as part of their sociology curriculum. The entire programme was anchored by Dr. Runa Das Chaudhuri, the convenor of the seminar. Following the Principal's welcome speech Dr. Chaudhuri invited the students to deliver their papers. The students who presented their papers included Bijoy Bera, Sourav Sardar, Souvik Mondal, Ruksona Khatun and Asadul Mistry. All the students belonged to the Second semester of B.A. Programme.

Bijoy Bera, Sourav Sardar and Souvik Mondal presented a joint paper on ‘Caste and its Features’. The second presentation was made by Ruksona Khatun on ‘Caste and Politics in India’. Asadul Mistry presented the third and final paper on ‘The Problems of Tribes in Modern India’.

Following the paper presentations, a short question and answer round ensued. Dr. Subash Biswas posed an interesting question to enquire about students' opinions on the impact that electoral

politics on the caste situation in India. Prof. Madhu Sriwastava, Head of the Department of English, BHKM congratulated the department for having organized the seminar on a relevant topic. This was followed by the distribution of a token prize which was handed out by Dr. Biswas to all the student presenters.
