INTRODUCTION AND ORGANIZATION

The Anti Ragging and Equal Opportunity cell of Bamanpukur Humayun Kabir Mahavidyalaya organised Seminar on vision of Dr B.R.Ambedkar .The requisite permission was sought from the principal of the college for the same, and the allotment of time and date was confirmed Notice and programme brochure were circulated to the students and the teachers accordingly. All the Resource Persons accepted the proposal and confirmed the presence.

THE PROGRAMME SESSION:

The programme started with the inaugural speech of organizing secretary S.Chatterjee .The lightning ceremony was done by Mr Parveej Ahmed and Principal Dr S Biswas . After the inaugural song Dr.S Biswas Principal BHKM ,as a keynote speaker explained that It is celebrated to foster and reinforce the values of communal harmony and unity in diversity in India. The organizing secretary Prof S.Chatterjee explained that, he is best known as the influential Dalit leader who led the committee that drafted India's constitution during the Constituent Assembly deliberations. Ambedkar was also a strong supporter of women's and labour rights. As such, every year on April 14, the birth anniversary of the social rights advocate is commemorated. Our chief guest Parveej Ahmed discussed about how the Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar played an important role in framing the constitution of our country. He outlawed the discrimination against lower castes or untouchables and wanted to establish equality among our countrymen. He said that he believed in a society where friendship, equality, and brotherhood exist. Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedker was a well-known teacher himself. He established People's Education Society in Bombay and Aurangabad to educate the students of Dalit community. His educational philosophy is reflected in his lectures, his published articles in various magazines and his work in the educational institutions. He said that every educational institute should be an agency of change society. Dr. Ambedkar strongly held that education should be a priority for the society and utilised for growth of individuals with character. Dr. Ambedkar wanted a type of education that not only inculcates awareness the oppressed ones to fight and remove injustice and exploitation they are suffering from ages. He recognized that, lack of education was the main cause for the backwardness of poor people. He preferred humanistic education which enables a man to rediscover himself and ensure freedom rather than being a student of the church, school or the state. He put all his efforts to ensure the educational opportunities to all the citizens of independent India without any discrimination, for which he framed some rights in Indian Constitution.
