### **Seminar on Yuva Diwas 23/02/2017**

#### **Introduction:**

The seminar on Yuva Diwas held on 23/02/2017 was aimed at creating awareness among the youth about the importance of their role in nation-building. The objective of the seminar was to inspire and motivate the young students to become responsible citizens of the country, who could contribute towards the growth and development of the nation. The seminar was organized in the seminar hall of the college, and the resource persons for the seminar were the Principal, Dr. Subhash Biswas, and Madhu Sriwastav. The seminar was attended by 45 students from the college.

#### **Activity Report:**

The seminar was conducted for an hour from 12.00-1.00 pm, and it was divided into three parts- an introduction to Yuva Diwas by the Principal, a talk by Madhu Sriwastav on the challenges faced by the youth in today's world, and A quiz based on the life, works and books on the life of Swami Vivekananda.

The first part of the seminar was an introduction to Yuva Diwas, which is celebrated on 12th January every year to commemorate the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. The Principal spoke about the role of youth in nation-building. He emphasized that the youth are the future of the country and that their contribution is crucial for the development of the nation.
