Organizational Session

The Department of Education of B.H.K.M organized An Orientation Programme On The Awareness of Covid Protocol time from 11am onwards, and proposed date for the seminar was settled. All the Resource Persons accepted the proposal and confirmed the presence. The meeting was conducted with students and the collaborative institution also.

The Seminar Session

The Department of Education of B.H.K.M organized Covid aware ness Induction Programme.The programme started with welcome address of Prof Sumita chatterje, Assistant Prof and HOD Department of Education, then Principal Dr S.Biswas of BHKMahavidyalaya focused on covid protocol that should be maintained in colleges . maintain a distance of 2 meters or 6 feet from others around you as much as possible. Not just mass gatherings, but even shopping malls, stadiums, and movie theatres can make you a target. In general, any gathering of over ten people should be avoided or conducted virtually. Prof Rezaul Molla explained the new normal situation. The institutes have emphasized on the 'no <u>mask</u>, no class' rule as one of the main criteria for in-person classes. Prof Agradip Paul mentioned that the institutions should train their staff and students to assist and undertake the work related to safety and health to prevent an outbreak of the pandemic in their campuses. Non-resident students should be allowed in campuses only after thermal scanning, sanitization of their hands, wearing of face masks and gloves.

Prof Sumita Chatterjee explained, Since the onset of COVID-19, higher education institutions like colleges and universities have grappled with keeping faculty, staff, and students safe from transmitting the disease. Many colleges and universities have introduced remote learning capabilities with all-virtual classes, and some institutions of higher education plan to offer distance learning through the 2021 semester solely. However, local governments or individual institutions determine exact restrictions and guidelines, meaning that in-person classes can still occur in some states. Protocol should be maintained for the Institution strictly. Prof Debraj Howlader convener Covid committee proposed for better hygiene environment for students. Prof Madhu Sriwastav , Assistant Prof and HOD Dept of English external member of the department focussed on the prevention and furthermore as the West Bengal higher education department has issued a list of guidelines for the safe reopening of colleges and universities across the state from November 16 so she explained the necessity of the colleges.
