# Report of the Seminar on "Adhunik Samaje Sanskritasya Upoyogita"

The seminar on "Adhunik Samaje Sanskritasya Upoyogita or "Importance of Sanskrit in modern society" was held on the 21.04.22, at 12.00 - 2.00 p.m. the conference hall of Bamanpukur Humayun Kabir Mahavidyalaya . The seminar was organized by Department of Sanskrit of the BHK Mahavidyalaya. The seminar was attended by a large number of students of Sanskrit of the college.

**Objectives:** Main objectives of the seminar were:

#### Activities of the Programme:

The seminar began with a welcome address by Sudipta Chaudhury, Head of the Sanskrit Department. He welcomed the participants and emphasized the importance of Sanskrit in the modern world. He highlighted the role of Sanskrit in the development of Indian culture, philosophy, and literature. He also mentioned that Sanskrit was the language of the ancient Indian scriptures, which contain a vast amount of knowledge on various subjects. Prof.& HOD, Dept.of Sanskrit,BHKM, spoke on the importance of Sanskrit in the digital age. He emphasized that Sanskrit was the language of algorithms and that it was being used extensively in the fields of artificial intelligence and machine learning.

The third session of the seminar focused on the historical perspective of the Sanskrit language. Mr. Jayanta Sarker Asst. Prof. Dept.of Sanskrit ,BHKM was the speaker of this session. He spoke on the evolution of Sanskrit from Vedic times to the modern era. He traced the development of Sanskrit literature, grammar, and philosophy and emphasized the importance of Sanskrit as a link between different periods of Indian history.

The Next speaker was Dr. Ajijul Haq Mondal, Asst. Prof. Dept.of Bengali, BHKM. He discussed on the influence of Sanskrit in Bengali literature. He highlighted that Sanskrit has had a profound influence on Bengali literature, particularly during the medieval period. Bengali literature, as we know it today, has been shaped by a synthesis of various traditions, including Sanskrit literature, which played a crucial role in shaping the language and literature of Bengal. He also said that Sanskrit was the language of the learned elite in ancient India and played a significant role in the development of Bengali literature. Many of the early Bengali writers were proficient in Sanskrit and were heavily influenced by Sanskrit literature, which had a rich tradition of poetry, drama, and epic narratives. One of the earliest examples of the influence of Sanskrit on Bengali literature is the Charyapada, a collection of Buddhist poems written in the 8th-12th centuries CE. These poems, written in an early form of Bengali, are heavily influenced by Sanskrit poetry and draw on themes and imagery from Sanskrit literature. The influence of Sanskrit on Bengali literature continued throughout the medieval period, particularly during the time of the Bengali Bhakti movement in the 15th-16th centuries. Many of the Bhakti poets, such as Chandidas, Vidyapati, and Jayadeva, were proficient in Sanskrit and drew on themes and imagery from Sanskrit literature to create their own unique literary works. The Ramayana and the Mahabharata, two of the most famous Sanskrit epics, were also translated into Bengali during this period. These translations played a significant role in shaping Bengali literature and culture and are still widely read and studied today. The influence of Sanskrit on Bengali literature can also be seen in the development of various literary genres, such as the kavya, a form of epic poetry, and the nataka, a form of drama. Many of the early Bengali writers, such as Krittibas Ojha, who translated the Ramayana into Bengali, were also proficient in Sanskrit and drew on Sanskrit literary conventions to create their own works.

The next speaker was Mr. Mintu Panda, SACT, Dept. of Sanskrit ,BHKM. He spoke about the role of Sanskrit in education. He pointed out that Sanskrit can help students to develop a deeper understanding of their own culture and heritage. He also emphasized the fact that learning Sanskrit can help students to develop cognitive skills such as critical thinking and problem-solving.

The Last speaker was Mr. Arup kumar Banerjee, SACT, Dept.of Sanskrit,BHKM. He spoke about the relationship between Sanskrit and science. He pointed out that Sanskrit is a language that is rich in scientific terminology and can be used to explain complex scientific concepts in a simple and concise manner. He also highlighted the fact that many ancient Indian texts, such as the Vedas and the Upanishads, contain valuable insights into the nature of the universe and can serve as a source of inspiration for scientific research.
